Testing is conducted by the Testing Center located at the Central and Brown County Campuses. Completion of pre-entrance testing is required by all applicants, regardless of degree completion, and must be completed before submitting a Nursing application.

The non-refundable fee is \$65 per test, and fee must be made prior to scheduling exam. Payments can be made online by logging into your MyRecords account, Select Account Information – Miscellaneous Payment – HESI Test. Payment can also be made by calling the SSCC Business Office at 800.628.7722, ext. 2652.

Once payment has been made contact the Testing Center at ext. 2792 (Hillsboro) or ext. 4792 (Mt. Orab) to schedule a testing date. The testing schedule may be viewed at <https://www.sccc.edu/services/testing-center.shtml>. Testing appointments are limited; register early and at least one week in advance. Food, drink & cell phones are not permitted in the testing area.
