- For dozens of different kinds of industries such as healthcare, business and financial services, and computer and information services the Occupational Outlook Handbook from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics tells you about occupations in the industry, training and advancement, earnings, expected job prospects, and working conditions.
- x O\*Net Online provides a service to search for career options based on career clusters, career outlook, industry, and job zone.
  - x MyNextMove.org provides a search tool that allows you to search by industry.
  - x The Occupational Outlook Handbook contains general information about different careers, including the training and education they require, earnings potential, job prospects, what workers do on the job, and working conditions.
  - x Ohio Department of Job and Family Services provides a series of links to websites which give helpful information on jobs available in Ohio.
  - x The Bureau of Labor Statistics has an Occupation Finder that lets you search for an occupation by education level, projected growth rate, 2012 median income and other categories.
